- Proficiency in statistical software (Stata preferred, R, SPSS, other) including being (very) comfortable with using statistics to interpret and present results in a user-friendly manner.
- Ability to work with statistical programming languages with guidance from senior staff.
- Experience conducting and analyzing data from surveys, large administrative data sets, focus groups, observations, and documents.
- Interpersonal skills to communicate effectively with a wide range of individuals.
- Ability to work in a fast-paced, deadline-driven environment.
- Organizational abilities to coordinate, set priorities, take initiative and exercise sound independent judgment within areas of responsibility.
- Familiarity with the educational environment (concepts, data sources, and terminology).

The ideal candidate will also have these qualifications

- Ability to create graphs using data visualization tools (e.g., Tableau, R, Excel).
- Knowledge of /experience with evaluation concepts, frameworks, theories and designs.

- A Master's degree in social or behavioral science with an emphasis on quantitative methods and two years of program evaluation experience or the equivalent is minimally required.
